March 2023

The following summarizes Economic Development Division activities for March 2023.

Economic Development Activities:

- American Recovery Plan (ARPA) Programming: Staff participated in the RTM meeting on March 8th
 at which the RTM Finance Committee presented the resolution to approve the Town Council
 recommended ARPA awards. The RTM approved awards totaling \$2,466,503. Next steps include
 official award notifications to projects followed by formal project award agreements.
- Claude Chester Reuse Public Meeting: On Tuesday, March 28th, a presentation was given to the Town Council by Chad Frost with the findings from the survey conducted using greatergroton.com. The Town Council voted to allow the Town Manager to move forward with hiring a firm to complete design services for the documented field needs for high school and youth sports in Groton. - Marketing Plan: Staff is developing an updated marketing plan to guide activities and investments
 for the purpose of increasing economic activity. A key component of the plan is defining specific
 target audiences and tailoring marketing efforts to reaching them with a relevant message. Specific
 target audiences include: Prospective Businesses, Regional Development Community, and Groton
 Residents.
- <u>Community Investment Fund (CIF):</u> Staff received notification that no grant funding was being allocated to Groton for the TVCCA Daycare project for new construction or the former Pleasant Valley School for site preparation. Staff is targeting ideas for the next CIF funding round this summer. A likely candidate will be a planning grant (up to \$250,000) used to refine a project to better position it for future implementation financing.
- <u>Community Challenge Grant:</u> Staff continues to coordinate with the state regarding the awarded \$8.4 million grant for various projects in the Poquonnock neighborhood. A legal agreement is being drafted by DECD. A final agreement will be provided to the Town Council for approval.
- <u>Standard & Poor Bond Financing:</u> Staff participated in the development of a presentation to S&P on March 29th regarding Groton's economic conditions. Groton is pursuing \$12 million in general obligations anticipation notes. One component of such review and rating by S&P is the local economic condition and outlook. Groton's official rating will occur early in April.

Public Property Redevelopment:

• <u>Public Property Redevelopment (Mystic Education Center)</u>: There was no activity in March. The current property today has over 160,000 square feet of existing building space including a 40,000 indoor recreation facility. Also, the site holds environmentally contaminated land.

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- <u>Public Property Redevelopment (Groton Heights):</u> Groton was advised that ThayerMahan will not
 pursue the Groton Heights redevelopment project. A letter was provided to the Town Manager
 regarding this matter. The project faces significant environmental remediation costs and the
 company decided to purpose property it leased on Leonard Drive. ThayerMahan has grown from
 three to over 100 employees. The Town Council was briefed in March regarding this status.
- Public Property Redevelopment (517/529 Gold Star Highway): PJ&A, holder of the option agreement, continues to seek quality developers. The Town Council granted an 18 month extension to the option agreement for the property. The project had envisioned about 324 apartments on 17.75 acres encompassing four lots (two town-owned and two private-owned). Anticipated tax benefits will be in the order of \$1 million annually. https://ctexaminer.com/2022/05/11/groton-council-greenlights-324-unit-apartment-complex-on-former-town-land/
- <u>Triton Square (former Seely School):</u> No change in March. The project awaits final resolution on the zoning approval appeal. The site plan for multi-family housing has been approved by the Groton Planning & Zoning Commission. Ground breaking is anticipated for a 305-unit multi-family apartment development. Targeted future tenants are both young professionals and "emptynesters." Anticipated future property tax revenue is in the magnitude of \$1 million annually. https://www.seelyschool.com/
- Public Property Redevelopment (Colonel Ledyard School): Bellsite, LLC requested and was provided a six (6) month option agreement extension since approvals have taken longer than anticipated. Plans have been resubmitted to the City of Groton's Planning & Zoning Commission for consideration. The detailed plans include a total of 64 residential units (multi-family). Phase I will modify the existing school building for residential unit development. Phase II will include new buildings and apartments on the rear of the site. https://www.exploremoregroton.com/news-and-media/project-updates
- <u>Public Property Redevelopment (Pleasant Valley School):</u> No change in March. Town Council continues to address the property reuse process changes prior to releasing this project for RFP. Staff received notice from DECD that the Community Investment Fund (CIF) grant proposal was not awarded for building removal and land preparation. Interest in the property by the development community is strong.
